Symposium venue and accomodation

The SealAix'06 Symposium will be held from September 25th to September 29th, 2006 in Giens, near Hyères on the French Riviera, between Nice and Aix-en-Provence.

A conference open to the general public on Recent Sea Level Changes in Response to Global Warming by Anny Cazenave (CNES, France) will be held in Aix-en-Provence on Saturday September 23rd, 2006.

All participants will stay at "La Badine" Village (Presqu'île de Giens) which is located in an exceptional setting in a pine grove (34 hectares of parkland) facing the island of Porquerolles ; the site has a magnificent view on the Mediterranean sea.

For lodging accomodation, "La Badine" village includes 99 single/double rooms in small buildings and 262 bungalows with two single/double rooms in each bungalow. Each room includes on large bed and one fully equipped bathroom.

By plane : "La Badine" Village is about 10 km from Toulon-Hyères airport which can be reached by plane from Paris (frequent flights).

By rail : you may arrive in Toulon TGV (high-speed train) station, 27 km from "La Badine" Village. Taxi service at the station.

Taxi service is available, but free shuttles will be organized for the Symposium between Toulon-Hyères airport and Toulon TGV station and "La Badine" Village. Information will be provided in the Third Circular.

By car : highway A50 Marseille-Toulon-Hyères - Exit Hyères - Direction « Giens » when entering Hyères (road D97) - "La Badine" VVF Village is located at the extremity of the peninsula.

Symposium themes

Major scientific themes for the Symposium will include records, sedimentary processes, and modeling of sea level changes (amplitude-timing) on carbonate, siliciclastic, and mixed margins, deep sea settings etc.

The Symposium will be structured around four themes corresponding to distinctive modes of the Phanerozoic Earth System :

1. Quaternary sea level changes ;
2. Icehouse Earth sea level changes (last 33 Ma) ;
3. Greenhouse Earth sea level changes (250-33 Ma) ;
4. Paleozoic sea level changes.

Symposium style

To avoid parallel sessions and to provide enough time for debates, the meeting will consist of one session per day which will include 1 keynote (30 minutes + questions/discussion) to introduce the theme and 8 talks related to the theme (20 minutes each + questions/discussion).

A series of workshop(s) will be organized at the end of each day. Their themes will be selected by the Convenors and the Scientific Committee from the participants' suggestions.

Travel grants

The Organizing Committee will help young scientists and students to attend the Symposium with travel grants including travel cost to France and accomodation in Giens.

Applicants must pay the registration fee and any other fees prior to the Symposium.

Young scientists and students who apply for a Travel Grant must send a letter to **Gilbert CAMOIN** (see address in « Contact ») no later than March 1st, 2006, along with the Symposium registration and abstract(s).

In addition, his/her supervisor or Department Chair must send separately a letter to **Gilbert CAMOIN** no later than March 1st, 2006, including the applicant's qualifications and explaining how the applicant's attendance at the Symposium would benefit for his/her research and home institution.

Abstracts

> Abstract submission

An Abstract volume will be prepared prior to the meeting and distributed upon arrival.

An abstract must be submitted for each presentation (oral or poster).

Abstract submission is free of charge.

Each participant may submit several abstracts for oral and poster presentations.

Abstracts may be sent electronically as attached Word (.doc or .rtf) or PDF document or on a CD to **Gilbert CAMOIN** (see address in « Contact »).

Authors will be notified of acceptance of their abstract(s) by April 15th, 2006.

> Abstract format

Abstracts are limited to two A4 pages, including figures (black & white) and references.

General layout : all margins (top, bottom, left and right) are 25 mm.

Title : Upper case, centered, Times, 14 pt **bold**.

Authors' name : Upper case, centered, Times, 12 pt.

Affiliation : Upper and lower case, centered, Times, 10 pt, *italic*. Numbers should be used to indicate the affiliation of each author. Email addresses can be added in parenthesis.

Main text : Single-spaced text using Times 12 pt in a single column. If needed, subsection headings should use Times 12 pt **bold**, upper and lower case, left adjust.

References : References in the text should be numbered. References should be listed in numerical order in Times 10 pt at the end of the abstract under a section heading entitled « References ».

A template of abstract is provided in this circular.

Oral and poster presentations

The languages will be English and French. No translation facilities will be available.

> Oral presentations :

Talks will be selected by the Convenors and the Scientific Committee of the Symposium based on the abstracts submitted. All other scientific contributions will be presented in Poster format.

The Lecture Hall has one large screen and one PC projector. Talks must be prepared as Power Point presentations ; participants must copy their presentation onto a CD or on an USB disk and give it to the technician on the morning of the relevant session at the latest.

Each speaker will be allocated 20 minutes for his/her presentation plus five minutes for questions.

> Poster presentations :

Posters will remain on display for the duration of the Symposium. Posters must be no larger than 0.7 m (width) x 2.1 m (height).

The highlights of each afternoon poster session will be presented by the Session Chairs at the end of the plenary morning session.

Workshops

Workshops covering current knowledge, future issues, and controversies surrounding sea level records, processes, and modeling, as well as strategies to address sea level changes within international programs of Earth Sciences (IODP, IMAGES, PAGES, MARGINS etc.) will be organized each day. The results of those workshops will be summarized and discussed during a plenary session on Friday September 29th, 2006 with the objective of producing a synthesis volume.

Participants are invited to suggest themes for those workshops (**Deadline : March 1st, 2006**). The final themes will be selected by the Scientific Committee (**Notification to proponents : April 15th, 2006**).

An IODP workshop on Sea Level Changes will be organized on Wednesday 27 afternoon, Friday 29 morning and Saturday 30 morning.

Final papers

The convenors will solicitate international journals to publish special issues including contributions presented at the Symposium. Further information will be provided during the Symposium.

A synthesis volume summarizing the workshop discussions will be produced after the Symposium.

Social Programme

> Ice-breaker and registration :

Participants will be able to register and collect their Symposium bags during this reception.

A reception will be held on Sunday September 24th, 2006 between 17:00 and 20:00 at « La Badine » VVF Village (Giens). The cost of the ice-breaker reception is included in the registration fee.

An excursion/field trip to the beautiful island of Porquerolles, one of the « Golden islands », will be organized on Wednesday afternoon September 27th (approximately from 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm).

The cost of the tour (30 €) includes the transfer to the island (bus + boat) and the guided tour.
